1. Outline of Business activities

The Japan Association of Translators (JAT) continued providing members services through seminars, meetings, networking opportunities and increased visibility. Membership increased by 10% compared to that of 2015 (820 as of March 31, 2016). JAT's wide-ranging activities, which include the issuing and distribution of the *Translator Perspectives* anthology, helped the public better understand translation and interpreting.
